Chances and Challenges for young people in different European Educational Systems

The title of the project implies the challenges and opportunities for young people in a united Europe. Taking into account the different rates of youth unemployment in the countries participating in the

Taking into account the different rates of youth unemployment in the countries participating in the project it becomes clear that it will take a concerted effort here.

A youth unemployment rate of 27.4% in Poland, 24.3% in Latvia, 22.6% in Sweden and 19.8% in Turkey shows, in comparison to Germany (5.9%) that here action is needed.

This project has been as yet been carried out at any of the participating schools. It is an attempt that teachers provide the framework of the project and the students are asked to complete this. The different types of schools present a particular challenge for their students.

Students from higher lever classes should be qualified to "job scouts", whose provide assistance in traineeships and education for other students in the same or lower grades.

They can be a model for other students from different types of schools in the participating countries. During the meetings the students shall set the toppics for her own work in the project and carrying out these in their own schools and bring the results on etwinning to their partners.

A very important target will be to install the "Europass" for every school as a "normal instrument" for the students. They shall learn to use the different possibilities of this European-Project.

As coordinating school, the Goethe-Gymnasium offers experiences in cooperation with companies of different size and orientation in internships and co-operation in teaching.

Every year students of the Goethe-Gymnasiums are involved in internships and one of the aims in this project shall be, to share this with the partners and established similar projects there.

The following forms of communication have proven successful in past projects:

E-Mails, eTwinning, Lo-Net2, Microsoft 365 and Skype. The first choice for the communication in this project shall be eTwinning. So the students can store and change their results and everybody can participate.

We checked the availability of the domain www.my-school-my future-my Europe.de During the project a new development of concepts for the job-orientation (Turkey, Latvia and Sweden) and a continuous development of the concepts from Germany and Poland at the participating schools take part.

An implentation of European components (international internship, learning and use of foreign languages) and cooperation in the future for job-orientation and international internships shall be the important targets.

The results shall be used by other schools, especially these with students of special needs. If it is possible, the students shall explore which jobs and internships are possible in the participating companies for students with lower level education and special needs.

If it is possible, the Goethe-Gymnasium will organize teacher-meetings with colleagues from special schools nearby during the meetings and students/teachers can be participate.

Bensheim is a historic town in southern Hesse and an educational centre in the beautiful Bergstraße district at the edge of the rural Odenwald region. A great number of international companies are situated nearby as the district links two important economic regions, the Rhine-Main-Area and the Rhine-Neckar-Area, and is in easy distance to major cities like Frankfurt, Mannheim, Darmstadt and Heidelberg. Tamsalu Gymnasium is a comprehensive secondary school in North Estonia. The school itself was founded 145 years ago. At present there are about 400 students (aged 7-19) and 40 members of staff. The school is situated in a smalltown and surrounded by rural area. The curriculum of our school focuses on subjects such as foreign languages (English, Russian, and German), Art, Music, History, Geography, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Physical Education, Maths, the Estonian language and literature, Psychology (Human Studies, Family Studies), Technical Drawing, Civics and Citizenship Education, Career Education, Economic and Business Studies, National Defence. In grade 11 the students have to do a research project. In preparation of this project in grade 10 all students follow a course fixed in our curriculum called Bases of Inquiry. After graduating, a lot of our students have successfully continued their studies at different universities in Estonia. A number of students in the school catchment area are bilingual, which means they speak Russian as their mother tongue and use Estonian as the language of communication and instruction at school. The previous projects have had a huge impact on such areas as students' self-esteem, attendance, academic progress and motivation. Contacts, especially with students all over Europe are very important to broaden their horizons not only by television or the Internet but by personal contact and raise their awareness of European citizenship. That's the reason Tamsalu Gymnasium considers participation in international European projects like this highly relevant. Tamsalu Gymnasium has participated in a Erasmus+ project "Choose Your Future" 2014-2016 and "New Technologies into Classroom" 2017 -2019. Tamsalu Gymnasium has an outstanding repertoire with regard to literature, modern foreign languages, art, and choral singing and is willing to share the ideas and best practices with the staff and pupils of the other two schools. The school has a 48-year-old tradition of organising song and dance festivals held each spring. In addition, the school has excellent sports facilities and the local sports centre together with the swimming pool, walking and jogging trails and ski tracks is the main attraction among the sports facilities of Tamsalu. Learning about different educational systems will give them new tools in their work, which will increase their motivation. The other benefit of cooperation is the trainees in each institution may volunteer to learn each other's language, especially on English as communication language. Furthermore the school staff will meet different cultures, learn to respect other cultures. The Project will promote cooperation between schools and nations, an Exchange of ideas and pedagogical approaches leading to the creation of a trans-national network and increasing the school's European dimension and prestige.

Impact on institutions
